**Abstract**

Some of the specialized services offered by the Forensic Imaging Office of the New York State Police are physiognomical (facial) reconstruction of skeletal remains, drawing facial likenesses from a victim or witness's description of a defendant, large scaled technical crime-scene illustrations, charts depicting situations vs. time vs. distance, image clarification, and facial age progressions.

Mr. Buckley serves the New York State Police as the Director of Forensic Imaging. Mr. Buckley has been a guest lecturer before the annual conclave of the New York State Bar Association. He has taught at many different state police academies, as well as at the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. Among the foreign countries Mr. Buckley has instructed in are the Republic of China, Guatemala, the Netherlands, Panama, and others. Mr. Buckley attended the University of Oklahoma (medical illustration courses), the University of South Alabama (facial reconstruction courses), the FBI Academy at Quantico, VA.
